Other factors left out of their analysis that would make the predicted number of students even higher include: HOPA age-restriction requirements; 55+ residents moving to RGPUD from single-family homes in Braintree and opening them up to new families; and MassHousing minimum occupancy standards.

The total number of students could be well over 100. Our analysis shows 55-106.

## 55-106 students will COST \$1.4M to \$2.4M, far more than the tax revenue the new development will bring in.
